Many of the Genealogy Societies from this area were invited to visit the new Abrams Historical Collections, Archives of Michigan. They were given a “behind the scenes” tour of the Archives and then they were able to complete the process for obtaining their new identification card for the Archives. They were invited to stay and work on any research they might want to complete.

We also have a **Greeter Program** at every meeting. This program asks that you arrive a little early for the meeting. This fun activity requires at least one volunteer but it is more fun with two volunteers. ***This opportunity to help would require approximately 30 to 45 minutes of your time.***

We are open from noon to 4 p.m. on the second floor of the Mason Public Library. We always look forward to having visitors come to see all of the information we have available. Sometimes we discover that our guests are researching the same family or families that we are. Sharing information with each other can be so rewarding. We have enjoyed so many stories that our guests have shared with us while we are assisting with research queries. There was a library patron that was using his computer in the Friends Area part of the library. He asked what it was we were doing in those "back rooms". He said that it sounded like we were all having a great time because of the laughter and the chatter. He was right! We have so much fun in only 4 short hours at a time. **We would welcome you to join us for the 4 hours. But if you can only help for a portion of that time we welcome that assistance also. *This opportunity to help would require the amount of time you are able to volunteer (1 to 4 hours) and the number of times you can do this throughout the year.***

**Do you have a skill that you would be willing to share with others?** SO MANY FORMS, SO MUCH INFORMATION. Maybe you are knowledgeable about a computer program that helps organize family tree information. There are several different programs available and maybe you can help someone choose the one that is best for them. Can you share your knowledge of "How To Get Started Tracing Your Family Tree"? Do you know how to add pictures to a Family Tree or how to create a DVD suitable for someone to share as a gift? Do you scrapbook? Would you be willing to help someone get started scrapbooking their Family Tree or maybe a Family Recipe Scrapbook? All of us have talents that we do not think about. What you think might be an insignificant talent might be very important for someone else to learn how to do. Think about sharing your knowledge with others.

As the year progresses we will have many additional opportunities to volunteer to help out our Society and our Society members. Most of our requests do not require a great deal of time from our volunteers. So as the New Year begins, would you consider making a resolution to Volunteer to help our Society in some way this next year?

**PROPOSED BY LAW CHANGES**

As members of the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS) we were entitled to have our By-Laws reviewed by them. Overall, they thought our By-Laws were good. They had a couple of suggestions that they felt we might want to clarify. The ICGS Board agreed that we should bring these items before the membership for a vote. We presented the information to our membership at the December 13, 2012 meeting / Christmas Dinner. Following is the information that was presented at that time.

Currently our By-Laws read:

**ARTICLE III: BASIS OF ORGANIZATION**

**Section 3: All facilities of the Society shall be available equally to members in good standing.**

**PROPOSED CHANGE:**

**ARTICLE III: BASIS OF ORGANIZATION**

**Section 3: All facilities of the Society shall be available equally to members in good standing. *For the purpose of this section, a member in good standing is defined as one who is current in payment of dues and not subject to disciplinary action.***

**ARTICLE XI: QUORUM**

**A quorum at any meeting for business transactions shall be composed of not less than twenty (20) active members.**

**PROPOSED CHANGE:**

**ARTICLE XI: QUORUM**

**Section 1: A quorum for the purpose of business transactions, at any *meeting of the general membership* shall be composed of not less than twenty active members.**  
***Section 2: A quorum for the purpose of business transactions, at any meeting of the Executive Board shall be composed of not less than 5 Board Members.***  
***Section 3: A quorum is not required for Committees.***

## NEWS FROM THE PAST

### **Ingham County Democrat – 7 June 1894**

Eaton Rapids Journal: C. J. **Barnaby** of Mason was in town on Saturday.

Chester, the 18 year old son of Joe **Howe** of Aurelius, had an epileptic fit while at the Island City feed mills, Wednesday morning. These attacks come upon him about every six months and last about four days. They are a result of spinal fever.

We wish to announce to the public that we are prepared to do undertaking cheap as first-class work can afford. We have a complete new set of embalming tools, the best money can buy. We have also remodeled our hearse to the latest style. Everything bright and clean. Give us a call. Yours truly, Mason Furniture Co, W. L. **Cheney**, Funeral Director.

On Friday, June 15<sup>th</sup>, Miss Myra L. **Wood** will close two years successful school work at Eden with a picnic at Variety Grove (J. W. **Chapin's**). Patrons of the school are cordially invited to attend.

The case of three boys charged with stoning C. A. **Monroe's** house was continued for two weeks on account of difficulty in getting a jury. Fred **McKeever**, one of the boys implicated, entered a plea of guilty.

### **Ingham County Democrat – 12 July 1894**

A. **McDonald** has purchased the Geo **Witter** house on west Ash street. He paid \$500 for it.

F. E. **Liverence** of Leroy was a member of the committee on credentials at the populist state convention.

Arnot **Moody** stepped upon a rusty nail last Tuesday just before dinner and injured his right foot quite badly.

The DEMOCRAT is pleased to announce that F. D. **Stanton** has been appointed agent for the M. C. at this station.

H. M. **Dresser** of Lansing has been sworn in as a deputy U. S. marshal. He makes trips between Port Huron and Battle Creek.

Don C. **Phillips**, optician, remains only this week. At E. **Culver's**. Eyes tested free.

The W. C. T. U. will meet with Mrs. **Neely** tomorrow at three o'clock. A full attendance is desired.

Will **Gregg** was fined the costs \$5.93 in Justice Squiers' court last Thursday. He was charged with disobeying military orders. Will paid and was glad to get off as easy.

A three-months-old child of John **Williams**, who lives near A. **Butler's** mill, died last Sunday. Short services were held at the residence the following afternoon at 3 o'clock, conducted by Rev. H. W. **Powell**. Interment took place at the North Aurelius cemetery.

Wm **Walsh**, an upholsterer who was injured by falling into an open cellar on Ottawa street, Lansing, about a year ago has commenced suit against the city of Lansing for \$50,000 damages.

Mrs. Jessie **Hills**, a young married woman who lives in the basement of the **Vandercook** house on the corner of Main and Mill streets, has a narrow escape from shuffling off last Saturday noon. She is troubled with hysterics and takes laudanum to quiet herself. This time she took an overdose. When her husband came home to dinner and discovered her condition he summoned her relatives and medical assistance. Dr. **Blatchford** responded and gave her an emetic. She was worked over until three o'clock before being out of danger and was a very sick woman.

**DISTINGUISHED SOLDIER ANSWERS LAST SUMMONS**

**COL. L. H. IVES PASSES AT SUNNYSIDE**

**Life One Of Devotion To Causes, Faithful In Peace As In War, Said Of Him**

From ploughboy on his father's pioneer Michigan farm to leading this regiment down Pennsylvania avenue in the grand review of the Union armies at the close of the great Civil war, is a thrilling story but is typical of the thrills and experiences which filled the life of Lucius H. **Ives**, which came quickly to a close at Sunnyside, his Vevay farm home, at a late hour Wednesday. Col. **Ives** had lived long and eventfully, and during his generation was one of Ingham county's most distinguished citizens. He was approaching his 88<sup>th</sup> birthday at the time of this death

Born on a Livingston county farm July 16 1840, the son of Samuel and Mariah Louisa **Ives**, the events of his long life are too voluminous to bear anything except the most cursory mention of the more important here. At twenty-two he was commissioned a lieutenant in Company B, 26<sup>th</sup> Michigan Infantry and left at once for three years of the most arduous and hazardous service. He was promoted to first lieutenant soon after reaching the battle fields of the south, was made captain April 26, 1864, and a major March 7, 1865. His regiment was engaged in some of the fiercest battles of the great war and at Spotsylvania is credited with losing half of its number in a single day. For six months he served upon the personal staff of Gen. Nelson A. **Miles**; it was his command that captured Gen **Lee's** train of 260 wagons three days before the final surrender; it was through the ranks of the 26<sup>th</sup> Mich. That Generals **Grant** and **Lee** operated with the flags of truce which marked the end. With his death has come the passing of the last of the commissioned officers of the famous regiment.

With the close of the war, the soldier returned to the soil and soon thereafter purchase the home in Vevay, Ingham county, which he christened Sunnyside and which during his years of activity became one of the beauty spots of the country known widely over the state as its widened his sphere in many lines of activity. In Grand Army affairs he has been recognized both nationally and in state department circles, at one time receiving appointment as state adjutant. He was a charter member of **Steele Bros. Post G. A. R.** and active in its affairs. He was an ardent and enthusiastic temperance advocate and for years was sought as a speaker upon this and other subjects. He broke away from the republican party where he was certain of recognition to assume his part in the organization of the prohibition party. He was active in the Methodist church circles, was a charter member, its first secretary and for many years president of the Ingham County Farmers Club; he was president of the state association of farmers clubs; he was a member of the Michigan Pioneer and Historical Society and one of the organizers and for many years president of the Ingham County Pioneer Society; he was a well known Sunday school worker and for years in summer would spend his Sabbath afternoons at some rural school house conducting religious services; he was for a number of years secretary of the Mason Free Fair Association, he served as school officer and township supervisor; he was active in every community and neighborhood undertaking.

September 25, 1865, he was married to Miss Libble E. **Cowan** of Parma, Michigan, and to this union were born three children, one of whom died in infancy, a son, Frank C, who lives at Sunnyside, and a daughter, Winnie, now Mrs. C. A. **Hughes** of Mattoon, Ill., survive. A foster daughter, Zada, also survives as does a brother, Frank of Unadilla, and two sisters, Mrs. D. E. **Watts** of Mason, and Mrs. Jennie **Parker** of Lansing. The son and daughter were at his side when the final summons came

Mrs. **Ives** passed away April 23, 1907, and four years later he was married, a second time to Mrs. E. M G. **Hawley**. The second wife died several years ago.

In the autumn of 1918, while at work in his orchard at Sunnyside, Col. **Ives** fell, receiving a badly crushed hip as a result of which he was forced to walk with crutches. This did not daunt him however and soon he was about his accustomed activities with all his former interest and vigor. About eighteen months ago a stroke of apoplexy so impaired his speech and eyesight that since then he has lived almost entirely at home where his son Frank has tenderly cared for him with all the devotion possible. During the past winter they left the farm to live in town and had just returned to Sunnyside for the summer when the end came. In referring to his life several years ago, a well know writer said of him, "Colonel **Ives** has been faithful in peace as in war", and from that moment these words have been often on the lips of the aged man as he has reminisced of the busy life he has led. The phrase sums up in a sentence what would take pages to chronicle.

Funeral services will be held at Sunny side at two o'clock Friday afternoon. Burial will be made in Maple Grove.

Shirley is a regular speaker at conferences and workshops across the United States and Canada, with a special interest in the Civil War and tracing your female ancestors. She has taught classes in Community Education Programs and been a guest lecturer at Michigan State University, The Union Institute, and Davenport College. The bound originals are located at the Library of Michigan, Lansing, Michigan in the Michigan collection. This is the only complete index available. The pioneer records index is found on the left side of our web page under ICGS Records.

Kris **Rzpeczynski**, head of the Abrams Foundation Historical Genealogical Collection at the State of Michigan Archives, has developed a website listing deaths of the Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons of the State of Michigan from 1930-1936. At this point there are more than 14,400 extractions. Additions are added periodically. One can find the decedent's name, death date, lodge name, number and location in Michigan.
