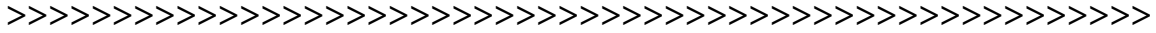

Your ICGS Research Room Wants You!!!

At this time, we have a vacancy on our ICGS board for a **librarian**. We are looking for someone that would be willing to fill this position and become the voting member on the executive board. We must fill this position on the executive board.

We understand that this particular position in the past has been the most time consuming position we have. The ICGS board is reviewing the current duties as they were defined many years ago. Times change and so does the ability to volunteer. As a society, we must review the duties of our board members and committee chairpersons so that they encourage volunteers and do not become a burdensome task for any individual.

The ICGS board has begun discussion on the librarian duties and about the possibilities of how this position will function as we move ahead. Therefore, as a society we will be discussing options for staffing our research room in the future. We are looking for feedback from our members on ways to provide access to the wealth of information we have available in our research room.

There have been several suggestions made. We could change the day and time for access. We could open only one day a month and not provide any research assistance to anyone visiting our research room. The volunteer would only be required to open the room, ensure that our material remains in our facility and is not damaged, make requested copies and collect the fees for these copies. A suggestion has also been made that our research room should only be available to members. This could be an incentive for some people to become a member of our society. (Currently, as a member of the Ingham County Genealogical Society, you are allowed access to our research room when the Mason Public Library is open to the public. If you are not a member, your access is limited to the time the research room is open to the public or by making an appointment with a member of our society.)

As our executive board and the society members discuss the future of our research room, we do have a temporary plan. Currently, we have a couple of people that have volunteered to commit one day a month as (for lack of a better term) the researcher in charge. This person will ensure that the research room is open and will oversee the activities in the room that day. The duties will include overseeing that additional volunteers are provided with information necessary to complete the various tasks that are needed to keep our facility functioning.

These additional volunteers may help to file collected material, make copies, and ensure that our material remains in our research room or direct visiting researchers to the information they are looking for. The librarian and the volunteer researcher in charge will work closely to ensure that the volunteers complete any requests for information we receive by phone, mail or internet that week in a timely manner that week.

If we do not resolve this issue soon regarding the librarian position, we may be required to institute a members only policy or adopt other measures for the access to all of our resources. This would be very sad for so many of us that have provided so many hours in acquiring this material and for those of us that feel our society has so much valuable information to offer those researching within our county. Digitized Newspapers Appear Online

Chronicling America, the free newspaper site from the Library of Congress, reported this summer that over 600,00 pages from over 1,100 newspapers were added to its database. Among the new additions are papers from Michigan, Iowa and West Virginia. The purpose of elephind.com is to make it possible to search all of the world's digital newspapers from one place and at one time. The database does not yet contain all of the world's newspapers, but it does have a lot. Elephind.com allows you to simultaneously search across thousands of articles using key words and phrases. Elephind presently contains 1,205,603 individual newspapers with a total of 1,141 titles. You can find a list of libraries that have contributed their archives on the site by clicking on "List of Titles." Clicking on any library's name displays the newspapers in that collection.
